SUBJECT: Fentanyl Administration

The EMS Agency has been notified by provider agencies of increasing challenges in the procurement of Fentanyl. This appears to be a widespread problem, and it is unknown when the shortage of Fentanyl will end. Because of this, the EMS Agency is implementing a temporary limit in the use of Fentanyl to ensure that it will be available to the patients that meet the criteria listed below.

**Effective immediately,** any patient requiring Fentanyl will need <u>Base Hospital Physician</u> <u>approval</u> prior to the administration of Fentanyl, <u>except</u> for severe burn patients, patients who present with ischemic coronary chest discomfort or patients with long bone (humerus, radius, ulna, femur, tibia or fibula) fractures.

The EMS Agency is requesting the Base Hospital Physicians to be involved in the decision when to administered Fentanyl by prehospital personnel. This decision is not meant to withhold treatment but rather to ensure that the most appropriate patients get Fentanyl while trying to protect the available inventory.

Once this medication shortage has been resolved, the EMS Agency will rescind this directive.
