Scholarship Opportunity

Fresno County Paramedic Training Program

Description

The County of Fresno is seeking qualified EMTs who wish to advance their careers in emergency medical services by attending the Fresno County Paramedic Training Program. Currently certified EMTs who lack financial means to attend the paramedic program are encouraged to apply for this scholarship program.

The scholarship program will provide for all costs for four individuals each year to attend the 12-month training program, which includes course tuition, books, and reimbursement of approved costs directly associated with the course. Qualifications

Applicants for the scholarship program must meet the following requirements:

1. A resident of Fresno County
2. Current EMT with 6 months of experience
3. Have been accepted to the Fresno County Paramedic Training Program
4. Employer sponsorship is not available

Application Process

Evaluation and Selection Process

A small group of individuals from the Department of Public Health and the EMS agency will meet to review applications. It may be necessary to schedule brief interviews to meet the applicants and ask additional questions. Two training courses are scheduled each year (January and July) and the intent is to sponsor an individual to each course.
