TEMPORARY EVENT PRACTITIONER REQUIREMENTS



REINSPECTION FEES: Re-inspection fees will be charged for multiple reinspections due to uncorrected violations.

CONSTRUCTION SECTION:

These are items that deal with the construction or setup of the body art booth.

1) DEMONSTRATION BOOTH DESIGNS. Booth must be a minimum 10ft x 10ft and have a barrier between booths that is at least 3 feet high. The body art booth shall be used exclusively for performing body art. Body art booth must also be equipped with adequate lighting.

The suggested maximum occupancy of each 10ft x10ft booth is 5. This includes 2 artists, 2 clients, and 1 helper. When conducting body art, the practitioner of Body Art must perform this in a safe manner, so occupancy will be restricted.

- 2) BOOTH IDENTIFICATION. The name of the business and the booth number must be clearly visible to patrons with lettering at least 3 inches tall
- 3) ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENT. Adequate electrical service must be provided at the site if electrical appliances are to be used. Secure electrical cords to the ground with duct tape to prevent tripping.

OPERATIONAL SECTION:

These requirements pertain to operational requirements.

- 4) FORMS AND DOCUMENTS. All body art booths must have all necessary forms available onsite at all times (i.e. client consent, medical history, aftercare instructions and client procedure logs).
- 5) REGISTRATION AND ID. A copy of the practitioner's California body art registration and photo ID must be visible at the booth for all practitioners conducting body art. Practitioners must register in Fresno County prior to event if they are not currently permitted in California.
- 6) PPE. No body art may be performed if personal protective equipment is not

- available onsite. This includes, but is not limited to nitrile or latex gloves, disposable aprons, face masks, goggles, dental bibs, etc.
- 7) DISINFECTANT. Disinfectant used inside the booth must be a product that is registered by the federal EPA and Department of Pesticide Regulation. It must indicate on the label, that the product will reduce or eliminate the presence of disease-causing microorganisms, HIV, and hepatitis B and is for use in decontaminating work surfaces.

Promotion, preservation and protection of the community's health
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- 8) SANITIZER. An alcohol based sanitizer dispensed from a pump container must be available in each booth.
- 9) SUPPLIES. Items used must be sterile and stored in a clean, dry area not to become contaminated. This includes, but is not limited to the following items:
 - a) Pre-sterilized and packaged jewelry.

 Jewelry that is placed in a newly pierced skin must be made of ASTM F138, ISO 5832-1, and AISI 316L or AISI 316LVM implant grade stainless steel, solid 14-karat through 18-karat yellow or white gold, niobium, ASTM F 136 6A4V titanium, platinum, or other materials found to be equally biocompatible.
 - b) Pre-sterilized and packaged needles.
 - c) Pre-sterilized and packaged needle tubes and bars.
 - d) Pre-sterilized and packaged piercing instruments, including needles, receiving tubes, corks, marking tools, and forceps.
 - e) Commercially manufactured inks, dyes, and pigments.
 - f) Disposable toothpicks and ink cups.
 - g) Plastic disposable protective sheaths for workstation equipment, including chairs, tray, tattoo machine and clip cords.
 - h) Single use tubes of water based and petroleum base lubricants.
 - Absorbent dressings and OSHA approved bandages and wraps.
- 10) SHARPS CONTAINER. A sharps waste container for disposal of single-use needles, razor blades, or other sharp items capable of cutting

- must be available in each body art booth. Sharps waste container must have a Biohazard label.
- 11) LIQUID WASTE. Liquid waste must be disposed of in a sanitary manner. Waste must be discarded in an approved disposal system (sewer, septic system, etc.) Do not dump liquid waste onto the ground or into a storm drain.
- 12) REFUSE CONTAINERS. An adequate number of leak proof lined waste containers must be provided inside each booth.



- 13) PRACTITIONER CLOTHES. Practitioners must wear clean clothes.
- 14) NO SMOKING IN BOOTH. Smoking and the use of tobacco in any form is prohibited.



- 15) ANIMALS. Except for guide dogs, signal dogs, or service dogs, live animals are not allowed inside the booth where body art is being conducted.
- 16) FOOD AND DRINKS. No food is allowed inside the booth. Only bottled water with caps will be permitted inside the booth.
- 17) INSPECTION REPORT COPY. A copy of the most recent inspection report shall be maintained at the booth (if the booth is inspected).
- 18) NOTICE OF INSPECTION REPORT
 AVAILABILITY. A notice shall be posted in the booth advising patrons that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available for review by interested parties (The notice will be provided by this Department if the event is inspected).
