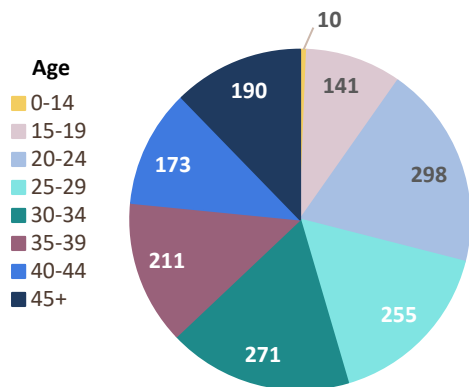


Figure 1. Fresno County Gonorrhea Incident Cases by Age (2025). 45% of gonorrhea cases are in those under the age of 30.

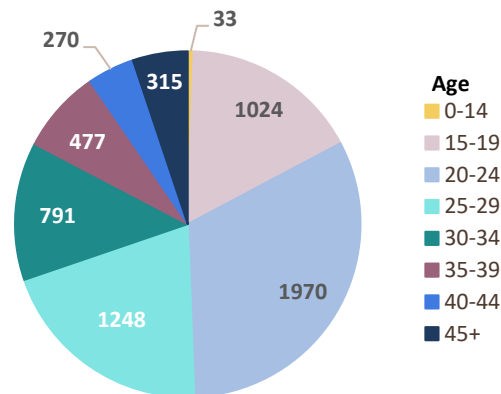
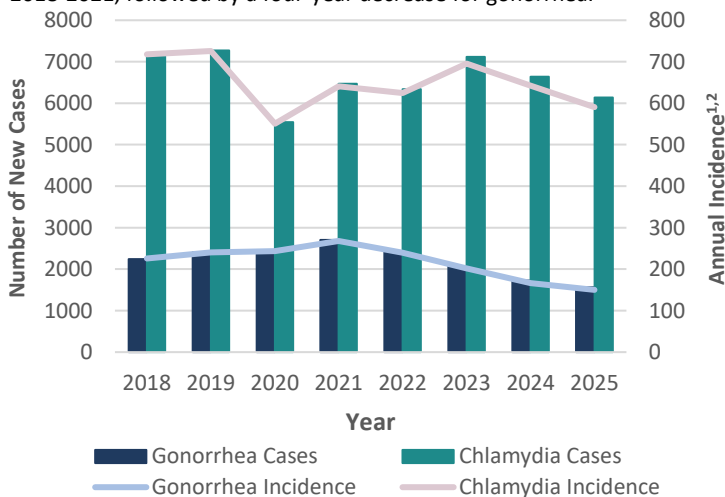


Figure 2. Fresno County Chlamydia Incident Cases by Age (2025). 50% of chlamydia cases are in individuals under the age of 25.

Figure 3. Fresno County Gonorrhea and Chlamydia Trends by Year (2018-2025). The incidence of chlamydia remained stable from 2018-2019, followed by a temporary decrease in 2020, before rebounding, then another two-year decrease for chlamydia. Gonorrhea increased slightly 2018-2021, followed by a four-year decrease for gonorrhea.

Table 1. Fresno County Gonorrhea and Chlamydia Incidence by Race (2025). Though Hispanics have the highest amount of new gonorrhea and chlamydia cases, Blacks/African Americans have the highest incidence in both disease categories.

Figure 4. Distribution of New Gonorrhea and Chlamydia Cases in the Greater Fresno Metro Area (2025). The highest incidence¹ for both gonorrhea and chlamydia was in downtown Fresno, zip code 93721. These zip codes represent residence and not the location where the infection was acquired.

Note: Incidence was calculated using zip code specific population estimates from the California Department of Finance. Zip codes with <15 cases, or a population <5,000 were censored to protect confidentiality.
