

At a Glance:

A Summary of Deaths in Fresno County (2023)

Points of Interest:

Figure 1 displays the proportions of deaths in Fresno County by race/ethnicity in 2023. According to the Census Bureau at www.census.gov/quickfacts/fresnocounty-california, Fresno County's population by race/ethnicity in 2022* were: White, 26.7%; Black, 5.9%; American Indian/Alaska Native, 3.2%; Asian, 11.9%; Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, 0.3%; Other, 3.4%; and Hispanic, 55.0%.

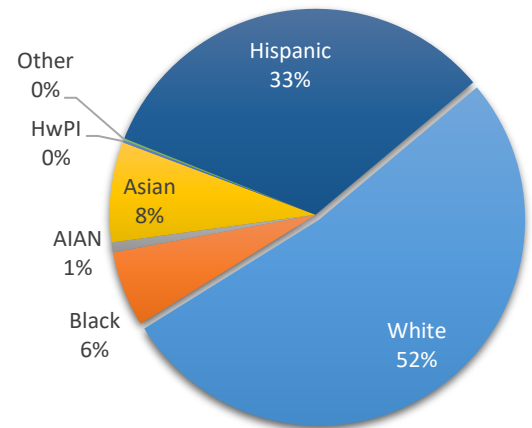


Figure 2. Deaths by year, 2013-2023

Figure 2 displays the total number of deaths each year since 2013 in the County of Fresno. While Fresno County's overall population has increased from 930,450 in 2010 to 1,015,190 in 2022* -- an increase in population of 9.1% -- the total deaths among residents has increased 44% during the same period (U.S. Census Bureau QuickFacts: Fresno County, California, accessed 27 February 2024).

Figure 1. Deaths among Fresno County residents, 2023

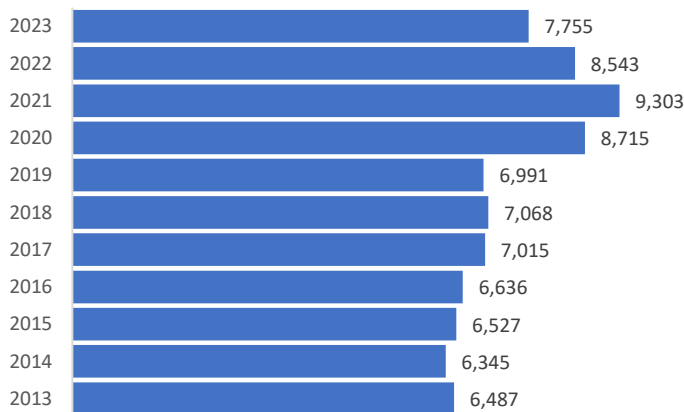
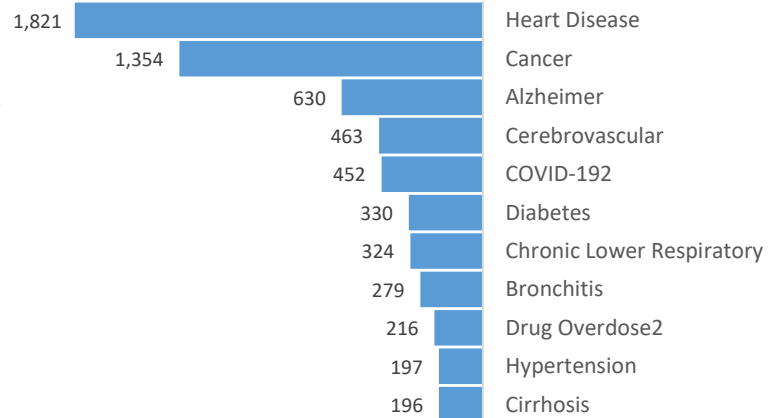


Figure 3. Leading Causes of Death, 2022
