... Citrus Bloom Declared in District 4 ...


To comply with the public notice provisions of Section 6984 of the California Code of Regulations pertaining to the citrus/bee protection area, Fresno County Agricultural Commissioner, Melissa Cregan, announced today that she is officially declaring the beginning of the citrus bloom period for citrus growing in <u>District 4 beginning at 1:00 a.m.</u>, <u>Wednesday morning</u>, <u>April 10</u>, <u>2024</u>.

All citrus growers, pest control operators and beekeepers must comply with the regulations covering the citrus/bee protection areas (sections 6983 and 6984, California Code of Regulations). The area within one mile of any citrus planting of one acre or more is designated in a citrus/bee protection area.

Cregan said that during the ensuing days, personnel of the Fresno County Department of Agriculture will be checking citrus groves in all Districts to determine when Petal Fall will be reached.
