CALAMITY APPLICATION FOR REASSESSMENT INSTRUCTIONS

You may qualify for a reduction or refund of property taxes if property you own (or are responsible for paying taxes on) was damaged or destroyed.

To qualify for a possible reassessment, all of the following requirements must be met:

- The damage must have occurred within the past year.
- The physical damage to the taxable property must be at least \$10,000 in value. Attach an insurance company estimate as evidence for your claim.
- The damage must have occurred by 'misfortune or calamity' such as a fire, flood, accident, etc. The damage cannot have been the fault of the owner. Demolition does not qualify.
- You may file the application if you are listed as the owner on the assessment roll, or if you are responsible for paying the property taxes.
- The application must be postmarked or returned to the Assessor's Office no later than one year after the date of damage.*
- The application is signed under the penalty of perjury. If you sign it outside the State of California, the application must be verified by affidavit.

Your property will be reassessed to reflect the percentage of loss due to the misfortune or calamity only if all of the requirements are met. Do not file an application if you do not meet these requirements.

* If your property was damaged more than 1 year ago, and was still in damaged condition the following January 1, contact our office.

PROPERTY TAX INSTALLMENT DEFERRAL

Under certain circumstances, you may be eligible to file for a Property Tax Installment Deferral for property substantially damaged or destroyed by a disaster or state of emergency as declared by the Governor.

To qualify for the deferral,

- You must pay the property taxes directly, not through an impound account.
- If your principal place of residence, it must have suffered damage of at least 10% of fair market value.
- For other types of property, it must have suffered damage of at least 20% of fair market value.

The request for deferral of the secured property tax installment payments must be designated by checking the box on the application.
