Key ARPA Highlights

- ✓ On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (H.R. 1319) into law.
- ✓ ARPA created a \$1.9 trillion package intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health, and economic impacts.
- ✓ Established help to turn the tide on the pandemic, address its economic fallout and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery.
- ✓ Has some flexibility to help those disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Key ARPA Highlights

- ✓ Fresno County will receive \$194,063,657 in Local Assistance Funding in two installments, spaced one year apart.
- ✓ Received 1st Tranche of funding on June 17th in the amount of **\$97,031,825.**
- ✓ Funds must be <u>fully allocated</u> by **December 31, 2024.**
- ✓ All funded projects activities must be <u>complete</u>; and funds expended by **December 31, 2026.**

ARPA Funding Categories

Category "A"



Support Public Health: Response Fund Covid-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff.



Address Negative Economic Impacts:

Respond to economic harms to workers, families, small businesses, impacted industries and the public sector.

Category "B"



Premium Pay for Essential Workers:

Offer additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors (up to \$13/hr increase with a cap not to exceed \$25k).

Category "C"



Replace Public Sector Revenue
Loss: Use funds to provide
government services to the extent of
the reduction in revenue experienced
due to the pandemic.

Category "D"



Water and Sewer Infrastructure:

Make necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water and invest in wastewater and storm drain infrastructure.



Broadband: Make necessary investments to provide unserved or underserved locations with new or expanded broadband access.

The American Rescue Plan (ARP) is a federal stimulus plan approved by the Congress of the United States and President Biden that provides \$350 billion of stimulus funding to State and Local Governments out of the \$1.9 trillion-state share expected to be received by Fresno County is approximately \$194 million. Eligible Uses for ARP Funds:

- Support public health expenditures, by, for example, funding COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff
- Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency, including economic harm to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector
- 3. Replace lost public sector revenue, using this funding to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic
- 4. Provide premium pay for essential workers, offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet

STATEMENT OF INTEREST INFORMATION

Starting Wednesday, December 15, 2021, the County of Fresno invites all organizations to express their interest in seeking potentially available ARPA funding through the completion and submittal of a "Statement of Interest" via email at ARPA@fresnocountyca.gov.

Please note, although the County will accept "Statement of Interest" submittals through Friday, January 28, 2022, the <u>County encourages organizations to complete and submit</u> the "Statement of Interest" on or before Monday, January 10, 2022.

The submitted "Statement of Interest" documents will be compiled and categorized and provided to the County of Fresno Board of Supervisors in February 2022. At that time, the County of Fresno Board of Supervisors may elect to "earmark" a portion of ARPA funding for a formal competitive selection process, which, if funded, is anticipated to be open in mid-February and run through March, 2022. Once the competitive selection process is complete, recommended projects will be considered by the County of Fresno Board of Supervisors, anticipated in May, 2022. Please note the "Statement of Interest" document is not an offer by the County for ARPA funding, Additional details are included on the "Statement of Interest" document, please see links below.
