FACT: Nearly all remaining funds are constructing the Agricultural and Industrial Technology Center at Merced College to provide essential job training for local students. In fact, Merced College leveraged \$12,600,000 in state matching money that would have gone to colleges serving other communities like LA and San Francisco.

Voting Yes on J will help Merced College continue upgrades and access additional state matching money that will otherwise go to other communities.

They say Merced College is losing students and funding due to poor performance. FALSE. FACT: The percentage of Merced College students completing courses, earning degrees, transferring to universities and securing employment ARE ALL ON THE RISE! The number of students attending Merced College has increased by roughly 12% since 2012, students are succeeding and state funding is not declining. However, the State provides no dedicated funding for facility improvements without local matching funds.
