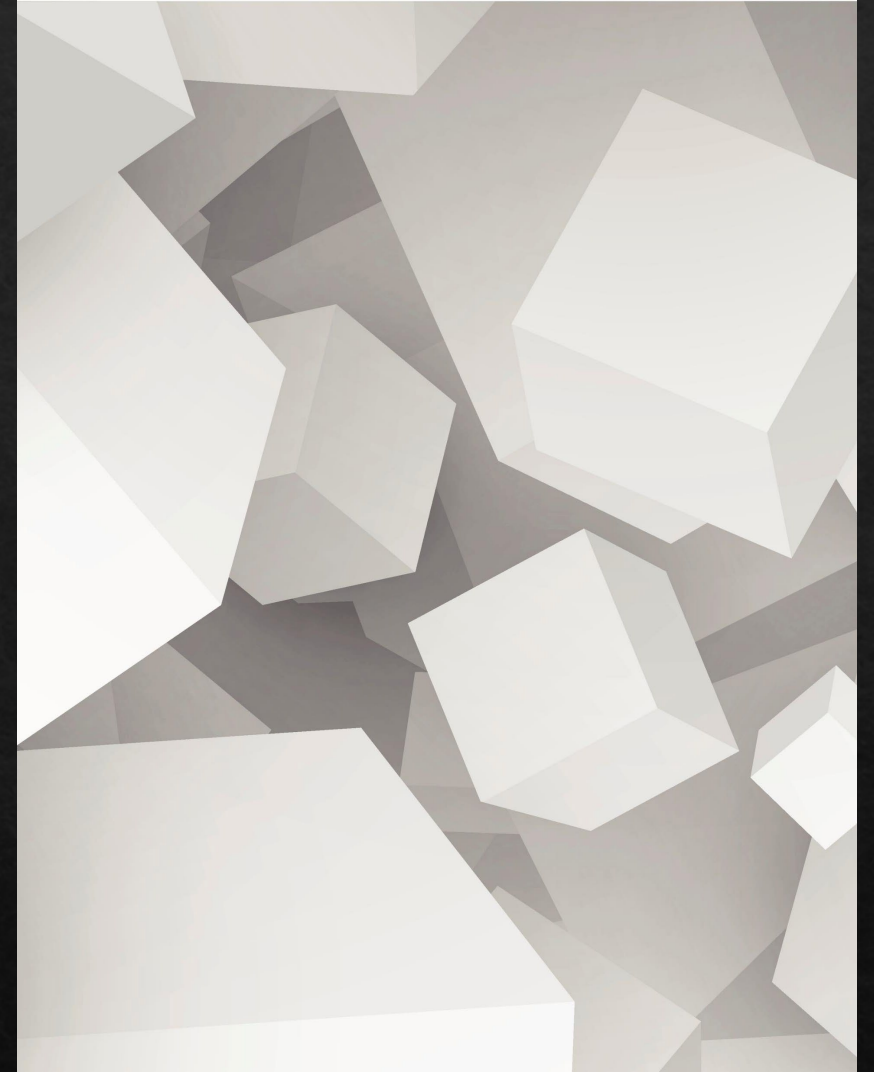

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to investigate and where appropriate, prosecute, those public officials or public employees who commit crimes relating to their official duties, including but not limited to violations of the Brown Act, Elections Code or Political Reform Act. Our Unit is intended as an adjunct to, but not to duplicate or interfere with, the work of the Fair Political Practices Commission.

PUBLIC OFFICIALS

- Elected or appointed to positions of public trust
- Community depends on them to carry out their duties honestly and with transparency
- Obligation to serve the best interests of the community

ETHICS

- AB 1234 Ethics Training
- Government Code §53234 et seq.
 - Requirement for local agency legislative body or any elected local agency official who receives any type of compensation, salary, or stipend or reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duties
 - General ethics principles and laws relevant to public service
 - Two hours every two years
 - Records maintained

 - Government Code §87100; §1090
- **Brown Act Violations**
 - Government Code §54959

MISAPPROPRIATION OF PUBLIC FUNDS

- Public officials and those charged with the receipt, safekeeping, transfer or disbursement of public moneys
- Without authority, appropriates to own use or use of another; Loans, makes any profit out of, or uses for unlawful purpose; Keeps false account, false entry or erasure; Fraudulently alters, conceals, destroys account; Refuses to pay over or transfer when required by law
- Penalty is up to 4 years in State Prison; conviction disqualifies from holding office

EMBEZZLEMENT

- The fraudulent appropriation of property by a person to whom it has been entrusted
- If public funds are embezzled the crime is a felony and the individual is ineligible to hold any office of honor, trust or profit upon conviction

BRIBERY

- Definition of “bribe”: anything of value or advantage, present or prospective, or any promise or undertaking to give any, asked, given, or accepted, with a corrupt intent to influence, unlawfully, the person to whom it is given, in his or her action, vote, or opinion, in any public or official capacity
- Numerous statutes prohibiting bribery targeting both the person offering the bribe and the official or employee accepting or soliciting the bribe

ELECTION AND CAMPAIGN VIOLATIONS

- Registration
 - Registration of persons not entitled to register or registration of a fictitious person
- Campaign literature
 - Use of agency seal with the intent to deceive
- Fraudulent voting
 - Not entitled to vote or voting more than once
- False declaration of candidacy

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

- Certain public offices require the office holder to reside within the district served
 - Examples: City council members, school board members
- Criminal violations include:
 - Filing false candidacy papers in violation of Elections Code §18203
 - Perjury in violation of Penal Code §118

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- Government Code §87100: No public official at any level of state or local government shall make, participate in making or in any way attempt to use his official position to influence a governmental decision in which he knows or has reason to know he has a financial interest
 - Financial interests include: business investments, interests in real property, income sources, business entities, gift sources
 - “Form 700” Statement of Economic Interest required for candidates, elected and appointed officials
 - Part of the Political Reform Act which is administered and enforced by the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC)
 - Can be prosecuted criminally
 - Prohibits the governmental decision making

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST CONT...

- Government Code §1090. Public officers and employees are prohibited from having a financial interest in any contract made by them in their official capacity or by any body or board of which they are members.
 - Financial interest more broadly defined
 - Not part of the Political Reform Act
 - Willful violations can be prosecuted criminally
 - Prohibits the financial interest

THE BROWN ACT

Government Code §54950 et seq.

In enacting this chapter, the Legislature finds and declares that the public commissions, boards and councils and the other public agencies in this State exist to aid in the conduct of the people's business. It is the intent of the law that their actions be taken openly and that their deliberations be conducted openly.

The people of this State do not yield their sovereignty to the agencies which serve them. The people, in delegating authority, do not give their public servants the right to decide what is good for the people to know and what is not good for them to know. The people insist on remaining informed so that they may retain control over the instruments they have created.

THE BROWN ACT CONT...

- Applies to legislative bodies of a local agency
- The Act governs the process by which meetings are conducted
- Basic Requirements:
 - Meetings must be open to the public
 - Opportunity for public comment
 - Notice must be posted/Agenda description
 - Limited Closed Session categories of discussion
- Criminal Penalty for intentionally depriving the public of information; DA or interested party may also commence action to stop or prevent violations of the Act

SUBMITTING COMPLAINTS

- All complaints must be in writing (mail, fax or email);
- The complaint must allege a crime;
- The subject of the complaint must be a public official or employee;
- The complaint must provide sufficient evidence to justify further investigation;
- The complainant must disclose if the complaint has been referred to other offices whether federal, state or local;
- The complainant can be anonymous.

Nomination/Declaration of Candidacy Filing Period

02/14/2022 – 03/11/2022

Extension Period (applicable when a qualified incumbent does not file by 3/11/2022) 03/12/2022 – 03/16/2022

All properly executed documents, with wet signature, must be returned to the County Clerk's office by 5:00 p.m. on the deadline (03/11/2022 or 3/16/2022 if applicable)

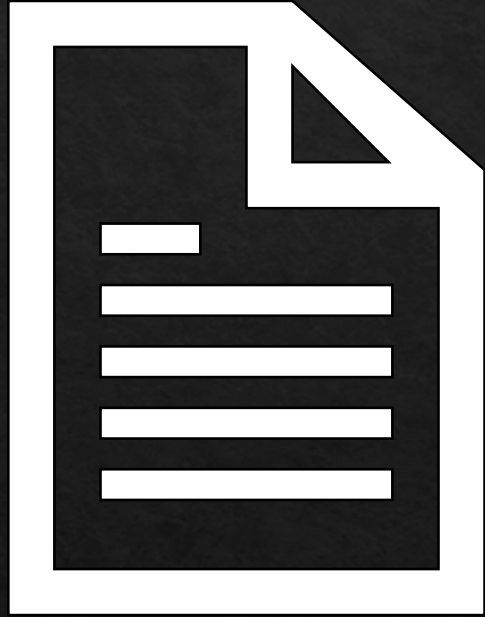


Declaration of Intention

◆ If the incumbent fails to file, any other person can file no later than 113 days prior to Election Day.

February 10, 2022 - February 14, 2022

◆ Filing fee is due at time of filing this document



Candidate Filing Documents

Signatures In-Lieu of Filing Fee

- ◇ Optional
- ◇ An In-Lieu Petition may be submitted to reduce the filing fee
- ◇ Who can sign your Petition form
 - ✓ You can
 - ✓ Any registered voter that is eligible to vote for you.
- ◇ Circulators of the In-Lieu Petition must be 18 years old or older.
- ◇ The In-Lieu Petition must be returned to the Elections office no later than February 9, 2022

Declaration of Candidacy

- ◆ Declaration of Candidacy must be filed between
February 14, 2022 – March 11, 2022
- ◆ Declaration of Candidacy must be executed in the office or candidate
may utilize authorization form.
- ◆ If an incumbent does not file their Declaration of Candidacy by the
close of filing, then contest goes into extension March 12, 2022 – March
16, 2022

Nomination Form

Filing fee is due at time of pulling Nomination forms

Each Candidate must file a Nomination Petition containing signatures of registered voters in the jurisdiction.

Each section of the Nomination documents must be filed with our office no later March 11, 2022 by 5 p.m.

Signatures submitted on the In-Lieu petition will be designated to satisfy the Nomination signature requirement.

Candidate Statement of Qualifications

- ◆ Optional
- ◆ This is a recitation of the candidate's own personal background and qualifications.
- ◆ It is recommended you review the section in the Candidate Guide regarding Candidate Statements before filing your statement.

- Congressional and Local Candidates – Fresno County
- Statewide Candidates - State Voter Information Guide
- State Senate and Assembly (who choose to keep their campaign spending under a specified limit) – Fresno County

Candidate Statement Continued

- ◆ The payment is due at the time of filing nomination forms
- ◆ Actual cost is calculated after the election
- ◆ Overpayment will be refunded
- ◆ Under payment will be billed
- ◆ Email to: clerk-elections@fresnocountyca.gov
- ◆ Statements may be withdrawn, but not changed.
- ◆ Statements shall remain confidential until the expiration of the filing deadline for nomination papers for the office.

Ballot Designation Continued

◇ A candidate may list:

- Words designating the elective city, county, district, state or federal office which the candidate holds at the time of filing the nomination documents to which the candidate was elected or appointed.
- The word “Incumbent” you can only use if you were elected to your current public office and seek election to a new term to the same office.

What Would Be Considered Unacceptable

Would suggest an evaluation of a candidate

Abbreviates the word “retired” or places it following any word or words that it modifies.

Uses “former” or “ex” which means a prior status.

No title or degree

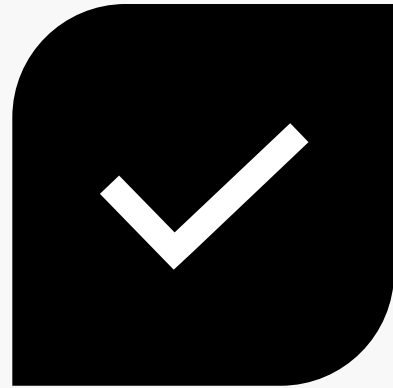
Would mislead the voter

Uses the name of any political party

Words referring to a racial, religious, or ethnic group

Refers to any activity that is prohibited by law

Must file prior to soliciting or receiving contributions or before making expenditures from personal funds

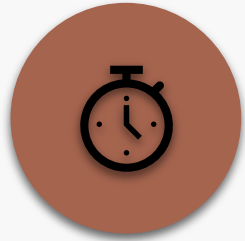

CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION LIMITS

AB 571

As of 1/1/2021, Campaign contribution limits have changed with enactment of AB 571.

Establishes a contribution limit for city and county elections, equal to the state legislative limit, and is regulated and enforced by the FPPC.

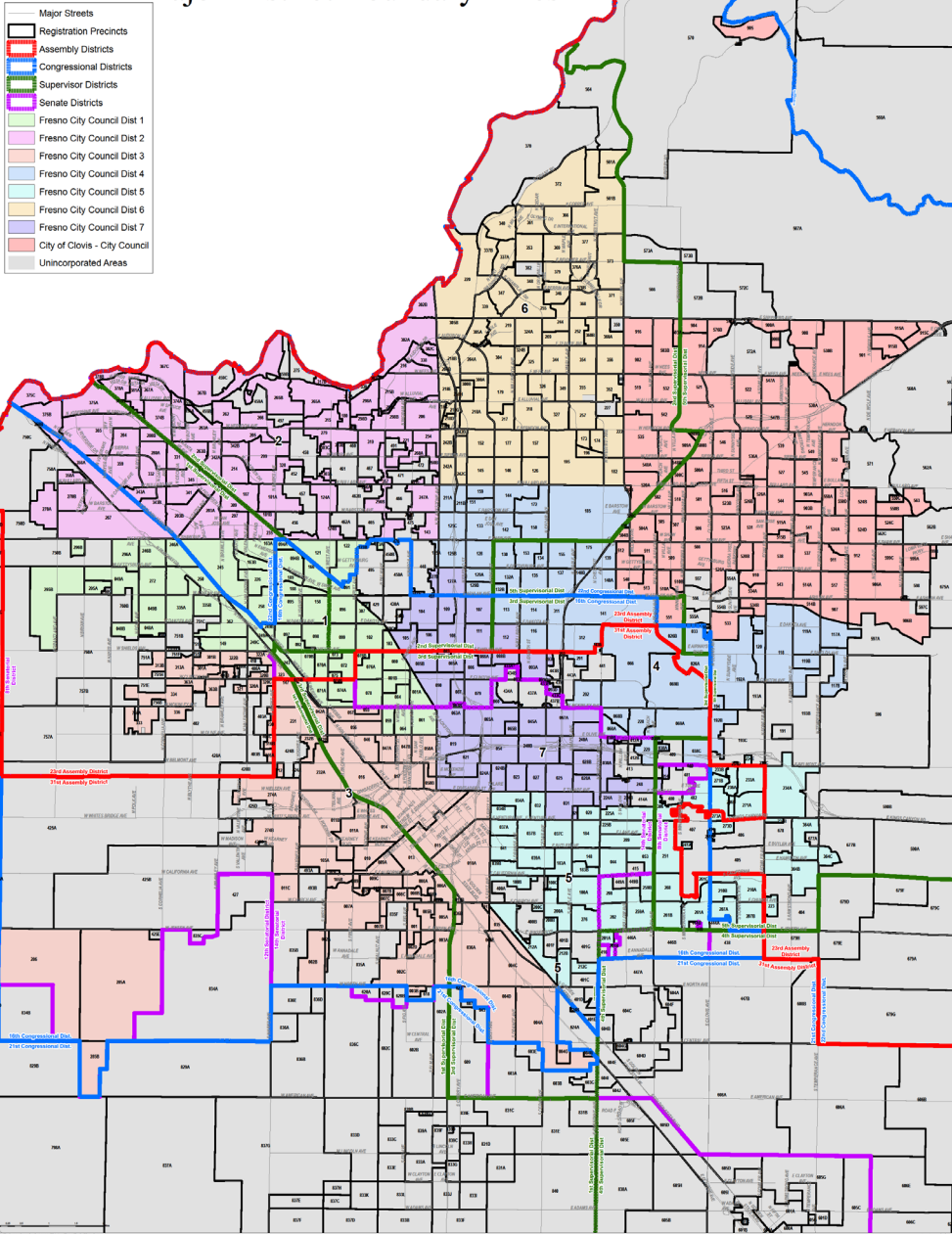

Fresno Metro Area Major District Boundary Lines

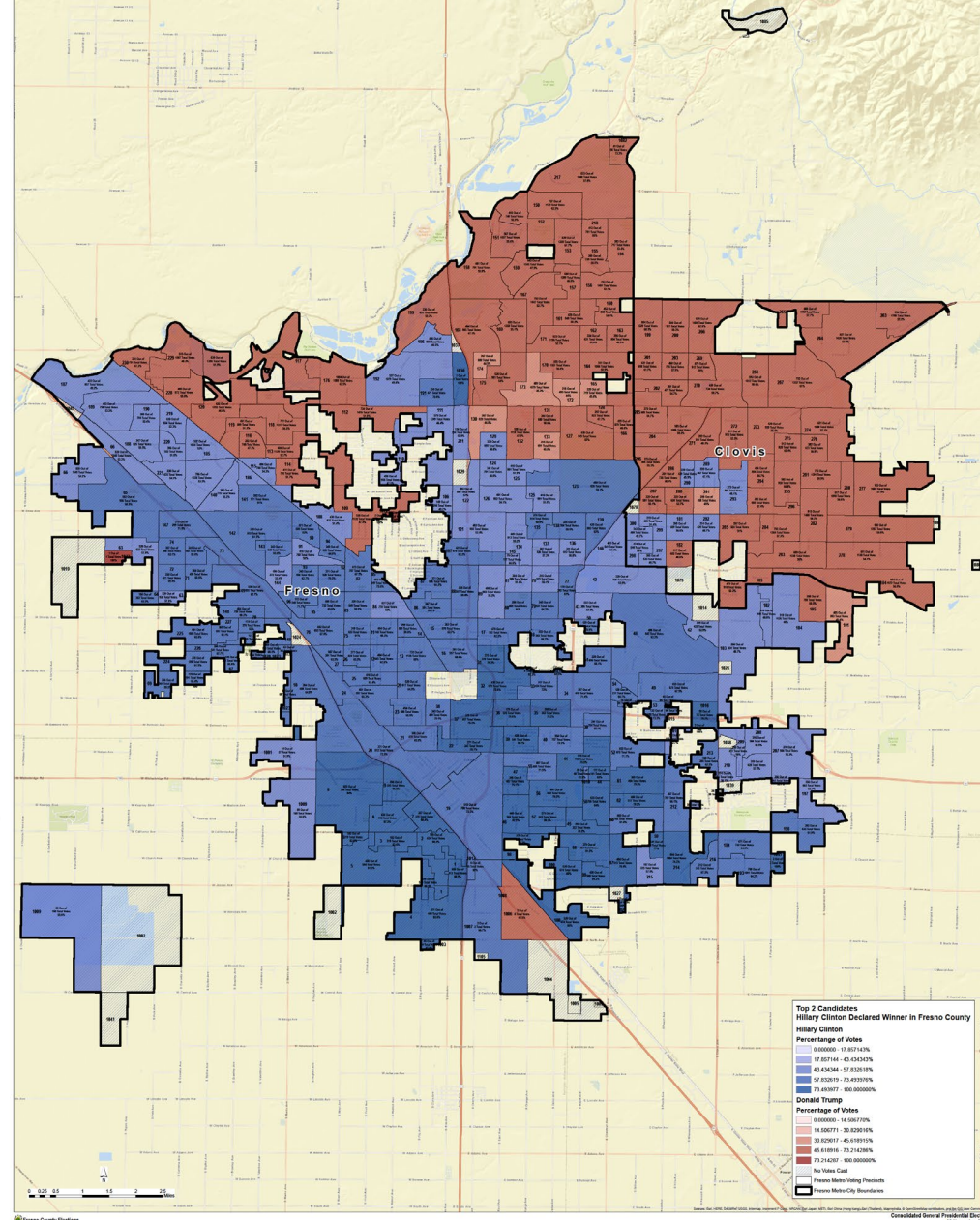
