JUSTIN CRITTENDEN SENTENCED TO PRISON FOR DEADLY DUI COLLISION AND IDENTITY THEFT

Deputy District Attorneys John Tully and Scott Hoedt are pleased to announce that today, June 12, 2015, Justin Crittenden was sentenced to the maximum sentence of fourteen (14) years and four (4) months in prison for committing identity theft in January 2015, as well as the May 1, 2015, collision that killed Michael Paul Navarette and seriously injured Cassandra Aderigibhe.

The defendant was convicted of gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated, driving under the influence of a drug and causing injury to multiple victims, and evading an officer. He was also convicted of committing identity theft and burglary in a separate case.

The cases were prosecuted by the District Attorney's "Impaired Driver Vertical Prosecution Unit" and the "Identity Theft Unit."
