DISTRICT ATTORNEY FILES ATTEMPTED MURDER CHARGES AGAINST MANUEL SERVIN RELATED TO WEDNESDAY MORNING SHOOTING AND POLICE STANDOFF

The Fresno County District Attorney's Office has filed multiple felony charges against Manuel Servin Jr. (32, of Fresno), for Wednesday morning's shooting which led to a standoff with the Fresno Police Department S.W.A.T. Team.

The felony complaint charges Mr. Servin with three (3) felony counts, including:

Attempted Willful Deliberate and Premeditated Murder of Jane Doe, along with an allegation that he personally and intentionally discharged a firearm which caused great bodily injury [P.C. 664/187(a), P.C. 12022.53(d), & p.c. 12022.7(e)];

Attempted Willful Deliberate and Premeditated Murder of fetus Baby Doe, along with an allegation that he personally and intentionally discharged a firearm which caused great bodily injury [P.C. 664/187(a) & P.C. 12022.53(d)]; and

Child Abuse of Jane Doe II [PC 273a(a)]

Mr. Servin is currently in custody at the Fresno County Jail. He is scheduled for Arraignment in Department 95 of the Fresno County Superior Court on Monday, October 24, 2016, at 8:30 a.m.

Mr. Servin faces a potential sentence of life in prison if convicted of the charges.
