Updates from Bambi

AB 1245 hearing 04/01/2024 view on state website. Health care professionals. Dr., Dentist, all nurses, nurse practitioner to sign forms. Expand to allow others to review in hopes to make it easier/make the process easier and faster to get their notes.

Internal discussion being they're for clients to make services quicker. Erika and Bambi attend meetings at state level IHSS AC to give feedback on legislative items to allow state to know what is helpful to users of the service. Feedback is important.

AB 1968 CalFresh for seniors work with CA tax board to auto-enroll eligible individuals 60 and older if they meet income qualifications. Still in the works. No hearing dates. AB 2241 Public Social Services reporting information verification by any means in person by phone fax etc. bill has no hearing dates.

AB 2446 coverage for infant/toddlers greater than 3 impacts minor children. No hearing dates.

IHSS AC asked for link to Bambi's notes. Bambi stated she will be included on the website and send notes for the agenda.

AB 3079 undoc providers can apply to be IHSS provider. Must get Tax ID and related to the 5th degree to recipient. Live in the same house. No background checks. They will sign form that they are not criminals and do not have a criminal history. No date to hearing or state review. May cause issues due to no background check. Committee is interested in bill and will follow up.

Senate Bill- SB 1078 language access creates offices of language access to across different depts to verify languages and accessible to all languages and types. Equalize with MC to have regionality availability. Hmong has still not been added. Resources to translate based on LA and San Fran, large cities.

SB 1355 IHSS redeterminations. IHSS continuous eligibility. 3 years after approval. Clients can contact SWs for help or to be redetermined. Eligibility workers being added for quicker processing.

Sick leave not used by June 30, 2024, will not carry over to FY 2024- 2025.

2 Applications- IHSS AC completed interviews in the past. Sent recommendations to following interview.

(2) For purposes of this section, "licensed health care professional" has the same definition as "health care practitioner," as defined in Section 680 of the Business and Professions Code.

AB 2800 (Kalra)

Re-referred to Aging & Long Term Care Comm.

This bill amend WIC 15610.57, 15610.63, and 15657 and would expand the definition of neglect to include (1) failure to implement a treatment plan, (2) failure to provide or arrange for services necessary for physical, mental, or emotional health, and (3) carelessness that produces or could reasonably be expected to result in serious physical injury, mental suffering, or death. This bill would expand the definition of physical abuse to include use of a physical or chemical restraint or psychotropic medication for discipline or convenience when not required to treat the resident's medical symptoms and administered by a long-term health care facility or residential care facility for the elderly, as defined. By expanding the definitions of neglect and physical abuse, thereby expanding the scope of the crime of failing to report the neglect or abuse, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. The act provides for the award of attorney's fees and costs to, and the recovery of damages by, a plaintiff when it is proven by clear and convincing evidence that the defendant is liable for physical abuse, neglect, or abandonment, and that the defendant has been found guilty of recklessness, oppression, fraud, or malice in the commission of that abuse. This bill would instead apply a preponderance-of-the-evidence standard for those cases. The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement. This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

Other Updates:

- IHSS Quality Assurance
 - CDSS will conduct a Quality Assurance (QA) Monitoring Visit in Fresno from May 6th -9th, 2024.
 - First in-person visit since pandemic
 - 40 cases will be reviewed and two field visits will be conducted

- Required case documents were provided to CDSS on 4/2/24
- Unannounced Home Visits
 - Annual program integrity activity to conduct UHV on 72 cases.
 - Focus this year is severely impaired cases with an unrelated provider.

• Employment Verifications

- Plans to all for providers to print their own employment verifications through the Electronic Services Portal (ESP).
- Due to feedback from counties, the deployment has been delayed from May to June in order to make changes.
