PROGRAM OUTCOME GOALS:

The program goals are to improve public safety, reduce recidivism, and improve mental health access and treatment for those in the justice system. More specifically, 35% of all exits from the collaborative court will be successful graduates.

Note: the graduate percentage is an unofficial goal projected for the report period by the BHC collaborative.

PROGRAM OUTCOME DATA/INDICATORS:

Recidivism continues to be low. Graduates from FY 15-16 are not included in the following statistics, as recidivism is measured 12 months after graduation. Out of the eight graduates from report period dated 1/1/2014-6/30/2015 one individual had a misdemeanor filed, resulting in a 12.5% recidivism rate for this graduate class. No one from other graduate years had charges filed against them in the past 12 months. Beginning with data from 2011, the total recidivism rate is 8.3%; the overall recidivism by individuals who had at least one new offense after graduation is 17.6%; the overall cumulative recidivism rate by incident is 23.5%.
