PROGRAM TITLE: Integrated Mental Health Services at Community Primary Care Clinics PROVIDER: United Health Centers of the San Joaquin Valley (UHC)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The intent of this project is to provide mental health prevention and early intervention services in primary care settings as part of an effort to integrate mental health and physical health care services at community primary care clinics. Mental health services will be provided at health centers to people who are starting to get overwhelmed with everyday stressors and go to their primary care physician with their symptoms (anxiety, depression, sleep deprivation, etc.). Co-location of primary care and mental health services fosters effective use of expertise in overlapping fields of knowledge and practice.

The specific activities to be delivered include screening, assessment, and short-term therapeutic treatment for individuals who are early in the manifestation of a mental health concern or disorder, as well as referrals to appropriate community resources and services as needed.

OUTCOME GOALS:

Ensure individuals shall be seen for an initial appointment within a maximum of 10 working days of initial request for service.

OUTCOME DATA:

Of the **1784 individuals** served in this reporting period,**100%** have been contacted and seen by the primary care clinics' Behavioral Health (BH) teams within 10 working days of the initial request for mental health Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) services. There were **1784**initial contacts with 10 days of request as part of **6475** total patient encounters.

Appropriate and early identification of mental health issues in underserved cultural and linguistic populations who frequently use health centers.

Of the **1784 individuals** served in this reporting period, UHC provided **9180 PHQ screenings.** Of these, **871** had a positive score. In 2014, UHC implemented **universal PHQ screening** for patients ages 12 and up. UHC has also continued a project with the California Health Collaborative Linkages to appropriate mental health prevention and early intervention activities offered at the CONTRACTOR(S)' health centers and throughout the underserved communities.

Linkages to appropriate long term mental health services outside the scope of mental health prevention and early intervention. to administer **perinatal** self-assessments and screenings to **pregnant and post-partum** patients.

Clients are linked from primary care to appropriate and integrated mental health PEI and low to moderate acuity services offered at the clinics. Services offered include case management, individual and family psychotherapy, medication management, and face-to-face and tele- visits currently serving pediatric, adult, and geriatric populations. All 9 licensed clinicians and 3 support staff are **bilingual** (English and Spanish). On-site BH clinicians staff **ten clinics in Fresno County** with **additional specialty tele-Behavioral Health visits** available in Parlier, Mendota, Kerman, Huron, and Orange Cove. **6475 individual PEI visits** were kept in this reporting period. For **psychiatry** services, **1,809 visits** were kept in this reporting period for **622 individual patients.**

121 individuals in need of help outside the scope of mental health PEI services based on client's condition have been linked with County Mental Health providers or other community-based mental health providers.
