Community collaboration was realized through talking to member of churches and as a member of the communitypartners for recovery of which Delta Care participates very well and provides different scholl supplies materials to families and their school age children. Most families do not have access to some community events and some of the children feel very deprived and you can see this in their eyes as they participate in social events with others. We have seen families who have resolved family conflicts because they were invided to the programs. Delta Care has intervened in family reunification process for clients and helped families to comply with other agencies including foster care providers.

Delta Care during the fiscal year 2017-18 seved 101 children 0-17 years old and 187 adults over 18. This included 196 Hispanics, 2 native Americans, 5 South East Asians, 36 Arican Americans, 45 Whites (non Hispanics, and 4 other. There were also additional 7 participated with no valid identification. Bassed on the program intended goals, Delta Care was able to bring families together for bonding by having park events. During the events families played games together, children met other children and learned how to interact. Staff helped to organize crafts and games for the children. The feedback was

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great as families reported how much it helped to reinforce or creating bonding among families. The essence is to help bring families together while teaching children how to navigate through life without drugs. The park events were very successful but the planning and execution were very demanding. In each of the events there was bouncing house and music, food and entertainment. The inhouse programs range from 30-60 minutes where staff teach parents some parenting skills that help them to work with various levels of the growing up. In one of the events there was a mini soccer game that taught kids about sports and pressure.
