## PROGRAM TITLE: School Based Team - Non-Rural PROVIDER: Department of Behavioral Health

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Non-rural (Metro) School Based Team provides for outpatient mental health services on school sites and includes individual, family \& group therapy, case management, and collateral services. The program is designed to improve and expand mental health services and supports for youth, K-12 grade (ages 4-18) with serious emotional disturbance and their families. To better serve the children/youth and their families the program provides for flexible hours of treatment.

## OUTCOME DATA

Clinical staff has recently completed CANS training as of February 2011 and will begin completing the outcomes instrument soon and go back retroactively to January 2011.

A total of 361 clients were served during the reported period of which $70 \%$ (253) is included in this data. Of the 253 clients recorded, $47 \%$ (118) improved their grades; 23\% (57) maintained their grades; $11 \%$ (29) were non applicable* and 19\% (49) were unreported (see Table 1).

DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION(S): Based on outcome and contract measurements reported, the Department recommends to continue MHSA Funding for this program for FY 2011-12
(125) improved their Attendance; 20\% (50) maintained their school attendance level; 14\% (35) were non applicable* and 17\% (43) were unreported (see Table 2).

Current data comparing clients pre-enrollment to post-enrollment is not currently available. As of January 2011, program will track the number of suspension and expulsions prior to enrollment vs post-enrollment.
