PRECINCT OFFICERS NEEDED TO SERVE ON ELECTION DAY, JUNE 7, 2016 Support Our Democracy-Serve Our Community-Learn the Election Process

FRESNO, CA. May 25, 2016 – Brandi Orth, Fresno County Clerk, today urged Fresno County voters to serve as Election Day Precinct Officers for the June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary Election.

"This one-day civic assignment is an interesting and fulfilling way to serve your community, and earn a little extra money as well," said Fresno County Clerk Brandi Orth. Precinct Officers earn \$150. for their day's work at the polls.

To serve as a Precinct Officer, you must:

- Be 18 years old, and a registered voter in the State of California, or
- Be 18 years old and a Lawful Permanent Resident (Green Card Holder) living in California, (AB817), or
- Be 16 years old, a Junior or Senior in high school, with a GPA of at least 2.5.
- Speak, read, and write fluent English, bilingual skills are needed.
- Attend a 2.5-hour MANDATORY training class per election.

Precinct Officers must be able to work on Election Day from 6:00 a.m. to approx. 9:30 p.m.
