The goal of the program is to provide DBH clients with temporary, on-site child care so that they may have the ability to
receive the necessary services from the Fresno County mental health department. We are also working towards complying
with the CARF performance measures. The value of this service has proven effective because with out it parents express
that they would often have to miss their appointments due to lack of child care. It has proven to be efficient because
91.33% of the clients who seek this child care service receive it. That percentage reflects the accessibility of the program to
the clients being served at the 2 DBH sites. This year, the two sites program outcomes were negatively impacted by the
COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic forced the sites to closed for 3.5 months losing out on potentially 1000 additional
number of services rendered during this time period.
