IV. Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) Update

DBH Facilities Updates

- Construction has begun at the Heritage Center and once completed, the crisis stabilization and psychiatric health facilities will be relocated, and two more facilities will be added in the future
- When the new design is fully completed, Adult and Childrens Mental Health Outpatient programs will be located at Clovis and Olive avenues as a combined campus
- Prior to full completion Childrens Mental Health will be temporarily relocated
- Announcement of temporary location will be at a future meeting

CalAIM Updates for individuals who receive Medi-Cal

<u>Enhanced Care Management (ECM)</u> – A new Statewide required Medical benefit added in Managed Care Plans (MCP) that will be led by a Care Manager who will coordinate clinical and non-clinical services using a person-centered approach to address needs.

<u>Community Supports</u> -All managed Care Plans are not required, although they are encouraged, to offer new services of 14 pre-approved community supports to eligible Medi-Cal members, regardless of qualifying for Enhanced Care Management services.

Upon regulatory review, it was revealed that the Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) report must be included as part of the plan. As well change in the naming convention from FY 2021 – 2022 to 2022-2023 reflecting that it is the plan for upcoming spending

- Must post for 30 days once edits are made
- The Department is requesting support from the BHB with hosting a public hearing at the June BHB meeting
- Once public hearing is completed the report may then be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval prior to submitting with the States June deadline

Legislative Update

- Governor announced proposal 3-3-22
- Individuals under Schizophrenia Spectrum and other psychotic disorders only
- There are many details that the Department is unclear on and will learn more to gain clarity

B. Quarterly Report on Housing Programs and Services

- In partnership with Fresno Housing Authority a Grand Opening Event will occur on May 5th for Villages at Broadway, a 26-unit complex with 12 units funded by No Place Like Home project
- Partnering with Upholdings Development continues as a 20 yr. commitment to support a large housing development with construction funded through a No Place Like Home Project for 123 units, 42 designated for persons with serious mental illness
- DBH issued another 20 yr. commitment Letter of Support to provide supportive services for a 69-unit affordable housing development with construction funded through Project Home key for students experiencing homelessness
- PATH Agreement with Kings View to increase max comp for dedicated rural outreach
- Master Lease Agreement with RH Community Builders will go to the Board in June with a suspension of competition due to unique management services and a need for new contract structure
- Housing Supportive Services Agreement amendment will be presented to the Board of Supervisors to add Alegre Commons and Butterfly Gardens to the contract with Exodus

D. Outcomes Report- The Fresno Center Culturally Based Access Navigation Support (CBANS)

CBANS is a Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) support service provided by The Fresno Center that began July 21, 2021, with a mission to empower individuals and families to live a well-balanced life, in mind, body and spirit. Annual Budget funded by MHSA PEI is \$550,000. The following data reported is for a 6-month period only.

Actual Expenditures as of 12/31/21-\$138,219.36

- Unique Individuals served: 632
- Referrals made: 277
- Majority age group participating 26 59 yrs.
- 25% are 60 yrs. and above
- 10% are ages 0 15 yrs.
- 1% of transitional age 16 25 yrs.
- 65% of individuals identified as Hispanic or Latino
- 23% Asian
- 7% Black or African America
- 2% more than one race
- 1 % white

VI. Old Business

Report on Site Visit to the Fresno County West Annex Jail

On March 22nd four BHB members toured a section of the Fresno County Jail that is under construction. In 2018 construction started on an addition to the jail of a section with the capacity to provide better mental health treatment, as well as to stop the use of the oldest section of the jail for housing individuals while incarcerated. The construction is expected to be completed and occupied with inmates in July 2022. Some of the accommodations of the design are noted below:

- Visiting booths and the Probation Department occupy the first floor
- The second and third floor each house150 inmates sectioned into pods of 24 28 individuals
- Small indoor recreation yards with windows provide outside air and sun. Although the areas may fit the criteria, BHB members stated that they are not appropriate to be considered as outdoor space "yards"
- A 24- bed area is available for jail- based competency treatment for individuals to restore competency, locally while awaiting to stand trial
- 2 safety cells that can be utilized for up to 36 hrs. until moved to an observation cell for up to 10 days before reentering general population
- 12 single cells for incarcerated individuals of high profile, violent or seriously mental ill that must be isolated for their own safety or the safety of others
