#### IV. Approval of Minutes from August 17th, 2022, BHB Meeting

#### V. Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) Update; Director, Susan Holt

**A.** General Update including DBH Events/ Suicide Awareness, Board of Supervisors Agenda Items and Legislation.

Director Susan Holt began her presentation by acknowledging September as Suicide Prevention Awareness month, Recovery month and Hispanic Heritage month. She continued with presenting suicide data in response to a question raised by a BHB member at the August meeting. The question was if whether the Department tracks data on age demographics? In response, detailed data was provided for deaths in the youth age range. The following is a summary of additional demographic groups of data that was provided from the years of 2018 – July of 2022:

- Gender higher number of males
- In the 2019, 2020 and 2021 age group 25–34-year-old had the highest numbers of death by suicide
- Month noticeable spikes in January, May & June in 2019 and in June of 2020
- Percentage of the deaths per race the percentage of total deaths more than doubled for the two specific races of Asian and Black

The Suicide Prevention collaborative uses this type of data to help identify areas where work is needed and is using different approaches for strategic outreach and awareness.

#### Data on Psychiatry Services at "Metro" clinic

- The DBH clinic that provides Psychiatry services is located on the University Medical Center (UMC) campus at Kings Canyon and Cedar
- Only DBH provided psychiatry services but no other contracted programs at this location
- Fiscal Year 21-22 data reflects 5,848 persons served

#### <u>Update on Peer Support</u>

- New Peer Certification training had 61 Peer professionals from DBH network of care participants
- A work group is under development for establishment of rate for claiming under Medi-Cal
- Certification exam is under development
- **B.** Outcomes report on Westside Family Preservation Services Network Youth Empowerment Centers (YEC)
  - Prevention and Early Intervention services for West Fresno County youth
  - Ages 10 24 and their family members
