PROGRAM TITLE: PATH Program

PROVIDERS: Kings View Corp

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) program is designed to provide intensive case management services for mentally ill adults who are homeless or at risk of experiencing homelessness. Psychiatric assessment with medication evaluation and follow-up to a specialty mental health component of 30 Severely Mentally III (SMI) homeless individuals in addition to linkage for 500 other unique individuals is provided. Services include funding for bridge and interim housing which provides for basic needs to be met. Once that occurs substance use and mental illness can be addressed. Education, support and case management occurs to provide an opportunity for independence and a consumer driven lifestyle with a variety of natural supports in the community to reduce stigma and assist in mainstreaming.

OUTCOME GOALS:

1. Reduce incidents of incarcerations for consumers on probation.

OUTCOME DATA:

100% of the 36 consumers, who received mental health treatment and ongoing case management decreased or maintained (at zero) their number of arrests, citations or probation violations in 2014-2015 compared to 2013

2. Reduce incidents of inpatient hospitalizations for consumers enrolled in the program. The number of hospitalizations experienced during the twelve month period prior to program entry is compared to the number 100% of the 36 consumers, who received mental health treatment and ongoing case management decreased or maintained (at zero) their number of hospital days in 2014-2015 compared to 2013.

experienced during the six month period prior to discharge.

3. Reduce incidents of homelessness for consumers enrolled in the program. The number of homeless experienced during the twelve month period prior to program entry is compared to the number experienced during the six month period prior to discharge 100% of the 36 consumers, who received mental health treatment and ongoing case management decreased or maintained (at zero) their number of homeless days in 2014-2015 compared to 2013 homeless days. Based on the PATH data for said reporting period active participants showed a 100% reduction in homeless days when comparing baseline data to current experience (from almost all consumers being homeless for the year prior to intake and 0 consumers homeless prior to discharge).

4. Consumer and Caregivers will report an improvement in social and emotional well being.

Consumer satisfaction data was collected during the oneweek Fresno County Satisfaction Survey collection period (May 2015). The raw data was submitted directly to the county and in turn to the State for data analysis. Detailed data analysis has not been requested to the State and the County has yet to receive data analysis for outcomes.

5. PATH will outreach to at least 440 homeless individuals each year, linking them with necessary health, social and mental health services.

PATH staff outreached to 600 homeless individuals this past year and enrolled 433 for various services.


