#### Children's Hope Scale All Sites 2014/2015

During the academic school year, 173 youth from Fresno County participated in the Children's Hope Scale. 148 of the youth also participated WRAP (Wellness Recovery Action Plan) program and the remaining 22 had WRAP concepts. The surveys evaluated for their "hopefulness" before and after.

The survey consisted of rating how much they related to 6 positive statements on a 1-6 scale.

QI: I think I am doing pretty well.
Q2: I can think of many ways to get the things in
life that are most important to me.
Q3: I am doing just as well as other kids my age.
Q4: When I have a problem, I can come up with lots
of ways to solve it.
O5: I think the things I have done in the past will

help me in the future.

Q6: Even when others want to quite, I know that I can find ways to solve the problem.

2= A little of the time
3= Some of the time
4 = A lot of the time
5= Most of the time
6= All of the time
