Corner Records, and any supporting documents (if any), can be initially submitted in PDF format for our review. The Record can be emailed directly to me by the surveyor preparing the Record. Any comments or request for the original Record will be sent to the preparing Surveyor.

The Corner Record shall have the stamp of the preparing surveyor on the Record. It does not need a signature at this time, unless it is submitted by someone other than the preparing surveyor.

We'll assign the Record a number, review it, and return it to you for revision or request the original. When requested, the wet stamped & signed originals should be on cardstock.

There are no fees associated with filing Corner Records in Fresno County.

Pursuant to [Section 8773.1](#): The board shall by regulation provide and prescribe the information which shall be necessary to be included in the corner record and the board shall prescribe the form in which the corner record shall be submitted and filed, and the time limits within which the form shall be filed. A corner record shall be a single 8.5x11-inch sheet which may consist of a front and back page.

Pursuant to Section 464(h): The Corner Record Shall be on a form prescribed by the Board. The approved Form is BPELSG-2016. (See: https://www.bpelsg.ca.gov/pubs/forms/corner_record.pdf)

Should you have any photos of the monument(s) on your Corner Record, feel free to send them. They can be included with the Corner Record after it is filed and added to the GIS as additional information
